






### The Reading Corner: Print Awareness

Print awareness (also called concepts of print) is the understanding that print carries meaning, that books contain letters and words. Print awareness also includes an understanding of what books are used for and how a book "works" how to turn pages, how to find the top and bottom of a page, and how to identify the title and the front and back covers.



Print awareness is a child's earliest introduction to literacy. Children with print awareness understand that print has different functions depending on the context in which it appears — for example, menus list food choices, a book tells a story, a sign can announce a favourite restaurant or warn of danger. Print awareness is understanding that print is organized in a particular way — for example, knowing that print is read from left to right and top to bottom. It is knowing that words consist of letters and that spaces appear between words. The ability to understand how print works does not emerge magically and unaided. This understanding comes about through the active intervention of adults and other children who point out letters, words, and other features of the print that surrounds children. Therefore parents can have a big part to play in developing and assisting print awareness.

Below are some ideas of how you can promote print awareness at home:

- Reading with your child: Not only do children benefit from the language they hear but they also learn how to handle a book e.g. looking at front covers, turning pages, page numbers and what direction to read in.
- Labelling objects: If you can label different things around the house. This draws attention to different words.
- Encouraging children to play with print: They can pretend to write a shopping list, construct a stop sign, write a letter, make a birthday card, etc.
- Reinforce the forms and functions of print: point them out in signs in the street, labels, posters, calendars, and so forth.

Don't forget there are opportunities for your child to read all around them, you just have to point them out!
